Why this conference?

- Truancy rates have risen by 10% to an all time high with approximately 55,000 pupils skipping classes each day.
- Last year 4,722 pupils were excluded from school for violent conduct in London alone.
- Each week at least 450,000 young children are bullied at school.

This conference will examine key strategies you can adopt to bring about a culture of 'respect' in your school to successfully reduce the incidents of truancy, bullying and violent conduct.

Truancy, bullying and violent conduct has been escalating problems for schools over the last few years. The Department for Education and Skills (DfES) has given schools powers, training, and support to deal with disruptive behaviour which has made an impact but is this enough to make a real difference to restore good behaviour and 'respect' in our schools?

In early 2005 the Government set up a Practitioners' Group on Behaviour and Discipline to develop strategies to improve behaviour and discipline and deliver a culture of 'respect' in all schools. The Group has reported their findings and recommendations on areas such as: teachers training, parents' responsibility, collaboration, national discipline code, exclusion appeals panels and protecting teachers. Find out how these issues affect you and your role.
